Rosewood Elementary will be sending out our bi-weekly newsletter, the Reporter, via e-mail again this year. In fact, almost all of our communication will come via email. Therefore, it is vital that we have a current email address on file for you. Please let us know immediately by calling the school office at 669-0011 if we need to update your email address.

Breakfast is Served

All Rosewood students are welcome to come to our gym Monday through Friday from 8:20-8:40am for breakfast. Drop-ins are welcome! Please join us! Breakfast is once again FREE this school year. We ask that you still please complete the application for additional Educational & Nutrition Benefits. (See next page.)

Electronics at School

Elementary Students may not use or possess a personal electronic device (phone, watch, personal iPad or computer, etc.) during the school day. Any personal electronic device must be kept in a locker or bag. Further restrictions may be implemented as necessary up to and including devices being held in the office for parent/guardian pickup.

Food Service Reminder

If you do not want your child to have the option of taking hot lunch or milk only, please contact the food service department at 457-2400 or lunchacctinfo@hpseagles.net to have your child's lunch card pulled. This is the only way to ensure that they do not have the ability to take hot lunch. You can do this at any time during the school year. You can also have a card released at anytime during the school year.

Friday Folders

Starting today, a Friday Folder will be coming home every Friday (or Thursday when there is no school on Friday) with our students and will contain all sorts of information. Please empty the folder and return it every Monday to your child's teacher.

Hand 2 Hand

If your family is in need of food for your student(s) on the weekends, please complete the form in your child's Friday folder. Hand 2 hand provides a backpack of food for our students every Friday, if you request one.

"No Friend Riders" on the Buses

Transportation Services has implemented a "no friend riders" rule. Students cannot ride buses to go with friends. Riding a bus to a friend's home is only permitted in emergency situations. Most buses are loaded to capacity with students assigned a specific seat. Additional students could cause an overloaded condition on the bus. In an emergency situation, the parent must call Transportation Services explaining the emergency. Upon approval, the driver will be notified. Thank you in advance for your understanding.

Medication

If your child needs to take prescription or over the counter medication at school, a form must be filled out prior to the office administering. Medication forms are available online using this link. A doctor's signature is required on all over the counter drug forms & prescription meds must have current label. Expired meds will not be taken or administered. All medications are kept in the office. No student can carry their own medications without proper documentation.

Parking Lot Guidelines

When dropping off or picking up your child from school, please be sure you follow our parking lot guidelines. If you come into the school to get your child, please park your car in one of the parking spaces. Please do not park in the drop-off and pick-up lanes or in the circle drive. When exiting the parking lots, please follow the signs regarding which way to turn out of the lot. If you make a "turn that is prohibited by a sign", the Ottawa County Sheriff Department has informed us that it is a \$120.00 fine and possible points on your license. It helps keep all of our children safe if we all follow the parking lot rules. Please see the attached traffic flow map. Also, please be respectful of our Rosewood neighbors by NOT parking on their lawns or blocking their driveways! Thank you!

Reporting Your Child's Absences

If your child is going to be absent, please contact the school by 9:00a.m. Our attendance line is 667-3550. If we do not hear from you, we will try to contact you or someone listed on your emergency list. We urge you not to send a child to school if any illness is present. If a child becomes ill at school, parents will be contacted immediately. A copy of our district's attendance policy can be found on our website.

Update Your Students Emergency Information

You should have received an email giving you instructions on how to update your student's emergency information. Please be sure to update this as soon as possible so we have current contact information for your child. Also, during the school year, please keep us informed of any changes in your child's medical information, or changes in your contact information. Thank you for your help with this!

Change of Address

If you have a change of address during the school year, please complete the <u>Change of Address Request Form</u> found on our website. You will need to fill out the form, and also provide proof of residency to verify your new address (a copy of a utility bill, rental agreement, or buy/sell agreement). If you have moved out of the JPS district, you must also complete a <u>Non-Resident Enrollment Form</u> for each student. Thank you for your cooperation!

Food Service News: Back to School Edition

We are so excited to welcome our students back to school!

We have lots of information available on our Food Service website.

FREE MEALS: The State of Michigan included free school meals for all Prek-12th Grade Public School Students in Michigan for the 2024-25 School Year. The Michigan School Meals program makes breakfast and lunch FREE for all students, regardless of their family's ability to pay. However, we still need families to apply for additional Educational and Nutrition Benefits. An approved application means extra funding for our school district Title I Math and Reading supports AND additional discounts for services at school and at home - Athletics, testing fees, technology fees, and even your home internet service! An approved application can also make you eligible for Summer EBT in 2025!

Don't Scrap the App: Please apply! Help your family and Jenison Public Schools! Apply online at https://jenison.familyportal.cloud.

Milk at School: Regardless of benefits status, Milk-only purchases will be \$0.60 per carton. Milk is included as part of the whole MEAL benefit. If a student only purchases a carton of milk, their account will be charged 60 cents.

No Fees to Deposit Money! We have ELIMINATED the fees to deposits funds via our online system! Head to https://jenison.familyportal.cloud to monitor your child's account and make deposits. Even though meals are free, we still sell individual meal items, snacks, and beverages. You can also deposit money at school using cash or a check (made payable to Jen Hud Food).

What if I left money on my child's account? The money is still there. Until it is spent or refunded, all money from last year rolls forward into this year.

PowerSchool: Please update your contact information in PowerSchool! Check those addresses, phone numbers, and email addresses!

Menus are available! Our menus and all nutritional information are available online at https://jenhudfood.nutrislice.com/ and printed copes of our menu can be found HERE on our website.

Our most asked questions: What comes with lunch? Each school lunch is made up of 5 parts - protein, whole grains, fruit, vegetable, and milk. To have the lunch "qualify" as a full meal and be FREE, students need to take at least 3 of the 5 items offered (they can take all 5 items), but one of those 3 items must be a serving of fruit or vegetable. If a student will not choose a fruit or a vegetable, that meal WILL NOT BE FREE; we have to charge them the a la carte price for the meal, which at Elementary level is \$2.50, and Secondary is \$3.00. What comes with breakfast? Each school breakfast is made up of 3 components that make up 4 items - 2 servings of whole grains, one serving of fruit/vegetable, and milk. To have the breakfast "qualify" as a full meal and be FREE, students need to take at least 3 of the 4 items offered (they can take all 4 items), but one of those 3 items must be a serving of fruit or vegetable. If a student will not choose a fruit or a vegetable, that meal WILL NOT BE FREE; we have to charge them the a la carte price for the meal, which at Elementary level is \$1.25, and Secondary is \$1.50.

Bottom Line: Please select a fruit or vegetable!! We offer multiple choices every day.

Appropriate Dress


Students are expected to dress appropriately for an elementary school setting. Attire this causes a disruption to the learning environment and attire with inappropriate messages, midriff-bearing shirts, and halter tops are considered to be unacceptable for school. A general guideline for length of dresses, shorts, and skirts for most students would be fingertiplength with arms fully extended at the student's side. No hats or head coverings may be worn indoors except for special events, for religious exemptions, or under extenuating circumstances. For health reasons, footwear must be worn at all times. Should a student come to school inappropriately dressed, or in a way that is causing disruption, a school representative will discuss the matter with the student and contact the parent, if necessary. Student Pick-Up/Drop-Off

We encourage parents to use the pick-up lanes in both parking lots to pick their child(ren) up at the end of the school day. Please follow the quidelines below so that the line of cars moves quickly and everyone can get in and out safely.

- 1. When using the pick-up lane stay inside your vehicle and pull as far forward as possible to pick-up your child(ren) along the curb.
- 2. Communicate with your child(ren) which lot you will be waiting at and encourage them to be out looking for you as soon as they can.
- 3. Please use a designated parking space if you need to get out of your car for any reason so you don't block other cars in the pick-up lane.
- 4. Please do not ask your child(ren) to walk across the parking lot on their own. All children walking in the parking lot need to be accompanied by an adult.
- 5. Do not use the circle drive for pick-up until after 4:00pm.
- 6. Traffic flows better if those coming from the east use the east parking lot and those coming from the west use the west lot.
- 7. PLEASE BE CAREFUL! DO NOT HURRY!
- 8. We ask that you are respectful to our neighbors. Please DO NOT block their driveways.
- 9. If you park on Roselane, please only park on the east side, facing north.

We would like to offer your student the opportunity to participate in a program at Rosewood Elementary called "Hand2Hand". This program helps provide a student with food for the weekends and is intended for families who currently may be experiencing a financial burden. The first backpack is set to be delivered on September 6.

Here's how Hand2Hand will work: At the end of the week students who are signed up for the program will receive a minimum of 8 food items in a black plastic bag. These food items will be a combination of breakfast, snacks, lunch and/or dinner items. While the food items are meant for the student, they can be shared among the family as well. (Please note: if your student or another family member has food allergies it will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian to check the contents of the backpack each week to ensure the food doesn't contain ingredients which could cause an allergic reaction).

There is no cost to participate! If you sign your student up to receive Hand2Hand, they will continue to receive the weekend food bag throughout the school year. However, if down the road you no longer need the assistance, please notify your child's teacher and or school office. 
