## After School Arrangements

In the morning before your children come to school, please let them know where they will be going after school, who will be picking them up, or if they need to ride the bus. It is very disruptive to classroom learning when the office has to call down to the classrooms to let children know their after school plans. Children can also become very anxious when they don't know their plans and have to try and call parents for this information. Thank you for your cooperation!

## Dress Code Reminder - Appropriate Dress

Students are expected to dress appropriately for an elementary school setting. Attire such as shirts with inappropriate messages, midriff-bearing shirts, and halter tops are considered to be unacceptable school attire. Dresses, shorts, and skirts must be at least mid-thigh in length. A general guideline for most students would be fingertip-length with arms fully extended at the student's side. No hats or headgear may be worn indoors except for special events or under extenuating circumstances. For health reasons, footwear must be worn at all times. Should a student come to school inappropriately dressed in a way that is causing disruption, the building principal will discuss the matter with the student and contact the parent, if necessary.

If your child is missing an item, please stop by the office and look through the growing lost \& found rack. All pieces not claimed by Wednesday, March 27 will be donated over Spring Break.

## Parking Lot Guidelines

When dropping off or picking up your child from school, please be sure to follow our parking lot guidelines. If you come into the school to get your child, please park your car in one of the parking spaces. Please do not park in the drop-off and pick-up lanes. If you park out on Tyler, please do not block the residents driveways. We have had many complaints from the neighbors that this is a problem. When exiting the parking lots, please follow the signs regarding which way to turn out of the lot. It helps keep all of our children safe if we all follow the parking lot rules.
