#### Calling In An Absence

When your child will be absent from school, please call the attendance line (616.667.3550) prior to 9:00am. In your voicemail message, please include the following items:

- Student's name with the spelling of their last name
- Student's grade & teacher
- Reason for your student's absence. If your child is absent due to illness, please include their symptoms.
- Your relation to the student.
- If your student is coming in late, please indicate their lunch choice. (white, blue, or cold)

#### **After School Arrangements**

In the morning before your children come to school, please let them know where they will be going after school, who will be picking them up, or if they need to ride the bus. It is very disruptive to classroom learning when the office has to call down to the classrooms to let children know their after school plans. Children can also become very anxious when they don't know their plans and have to try and call parents for this information. Thank you for your cooperation!

Most school-age kids need 10 to 12 hours of sleep a night.



Our wrestling room houses all of our practices for the high school and the kids club. We will be following these rules to ensure the room stays safe for all wrestlers.

### No registration required for trial days! A guardian must stay on site.

\*NEW SWIMMERS\* are required to attend a free trial day to meet the coaches, swim some laps, and determine whether they want to continue as a JENISON AGE GROUP SWIMMER! New swimmers should have completed through Level 3 of our JPS Swim Lessons <u>OR</u> be able to swim one lap (25 yards) of both modified backstroke <u>AND</u> modified freestyle. Swimmers will need a suit, goggles, and towel. Swimmers with long hair should wear a swim cap or have their hair tied up. <u>Parents must stay for the trial practice</u> and are welcome to view all practices from the pool balcony (stairwell to the balcony is in the lobby near the main entrance).

Athletes must be registered and paid to attend practices after the FREE trial days.
