Transportation Services has implemented a "no friend riders" rule. Students cannot ride buses to go with friends. Riding a bus to a friend's home is only permitted in emergency situations. Most buses are loaded to capacity with students assigned a specific seat. Additional students could cause an overloaded condition on the bus. In an emergency situation, the parent must call Transportation Services explaining the emergency. Upon approval, the odriver will be notified. Thank you in advance for your understanding.

Update Your Students Emergency Information

You should have received an email giving you instructions on how to update your student's emergency information. Medication

If your child needs to take prescription or over the counter medication at school, a form must be filled out prior to the office administering. Medication forms are available online using this <u>link</u>. A doctor's signature is required on all over the counter drug forms & prescription meds must have current label. Expired meds will not be taken or administered. All medications are kept in the office.

Reporting Your Child's Absences

If your child is going to be absent, please contact the school by 8:50 a.m. Our attendance line is 667-3550. If we do not hear from you, we will try to contact you or someone listed on your emergency list. We urge you not to send a child to school if any illness is present. If a child becomes ill at school, parents will be contacted immediately.

Kid Cat Football Game September 6, 2024


KidCats Game - A Tradition of Connecting Elementary Students to Wildcat Role Models



Student Pick-Up/Drop-Off

We encourage parents to use the pick-up lanes in both parking lots to pick their child(ren) up at the end of the school day. Please follow the guidelines below so that the line of cars moves quickly and everyone can get in and out safely.

- 1. When using the pick-up lane stay inside your vehicle and pull as far forward as possible to pick-up your child(ren) along the curb.
- 2. Communicate with your child(ren) which lot you will be waiting at and encourage them to be out looking for you as soon as they can.
- 3. Please use a designated parking space if you need to get out of your car for any reason so you don't block other cars in the pick-up lane.
- 4. Please do not ask your child(ren) to walk across the parking lot on their own. All children walking in the parking lot need to be accompanied by an adult.
- 5. Do not use the circle drive for pick-up until after 4:00pm.
- 6. Traffic flows better if those coming from the east use the east parking lot and those coming from the west use the west lot.
- 7. PLEASE BE CAREFUL! DO NOT HURRY!
- 8. We ask that you are respectful to our neighbors. Please DO NOT block their driveways.
- 9. If you park on Roselane, please only park on the east side, facing north.

Help Your Child Succeed in School: **Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early**

DID YOU KNOW?


- Starting in preschool and kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10%, or about 2 days each month over the course of a school year, can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just 1 or 2 days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences and tardiness can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Eventually good attendance will be a skill that will help them succeed in high school and college.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Keep your child healthy and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your children to their teachers and classmates before school starts.
- Develop backup plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor or another parent.
- Try to schedule non-Covid-19 related medical appointments and extended trips when school isn't in session.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors and other parents for advice on how to make your child feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- If you are concerned that your child may have Covid-19, call your school for advice.
- If your child must stay home due to illness or quarantine, ask the teacher for resources and ideas to continue learning at home.

We would like to offer your student the opportunity to participate in a program at Rosewood Elementary called "Hand2Hand". This program helps provide a student with food for the weekends and is intended for families who currently may be experiencing a financial burden. The first backpack is set to be delivered on September 6.

Here's how Hand2Hand will work: At the end of the week students who are signed up for the program will receive a minimum of 8 food items in a black plastic bag. These food items will be a combination of breakfast, snacks, lunch and/or dinner items. While the food items are meant for the student, they can be shared among the family as well. (Please note: if your student or another family member has food allergies it will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian to check the contents of the backpack each week to ensure the food doesn't contain ingredients which could cause an allergic reaction).

There is no cost to participate! If you sign your student up to receive Hand2Hand, they will continue to receive the weekend food bag throughout the school year. However, if down the road you no longer need the assistance, please notify your child's teacher and or school office.
