Transportation Services has implemented a "no friend riders" rule. Students cannot ride buses to go with friends. Riding a bus to a friend's home is only permitted in emergency situations. Most buses are loaded to capacity with students assigned a specific seat. Additional students could cause an overloaded condition on the bus. In an emergency situation, the parent must call Transportation Services explaining the emergency. Upon approval, the odriver will be notified. Thank you in advance for your understanding.

Update Your Students Emergency Information

You should have received an email giving you instructions on how to update your student's emergency information. Please be sure to update this as soon as possible so we have the current contact information for your child. Everyone needs to do this, even if there have been no changes to your child's information. The subject of the email is: "Jenison Public School District Annual Student Information Update" if you want to search for it or check your spam. The office staff at Rosewood will start making phone calls to anyone who has not done the updating, so please help us out by completing your updates as soon as possible. Thank You!

Medication

If your child needs to take prescription or over the counter medication at school, a form must be filled out prior to the office administering. Medication forms are available online using this <u>link</u>. A doctor's signature is required on all over the counter drug forms & prescription meds must have current label. Expired meds will not be taken or administered. All medications are kept in the office. No student can carry their own medications without proper documentation.

Reporting Your Child's Absences

If your child is going to be absent, please contact the school by 8:50 a.m. Our attendance line is 667-3550. If we do not hear from you, we will try to contact you or someone listed on your emergency list. We urge you not to send a child to school if any illness is present. If a child becomes ill at school, parents will be contacted immediately.

Appropriate Dress

Students are expected to dress appropriately for an elementary school setting. Attire that causes a disruption to the learning environment and attire with inappropriate messages, midriff-bearing shirts, and halter tops are considered to be unacceptable for school. A general guideline for length of dresses, shorts and skirts for most students would be fingertiplength with arms fully extended at the student's side. No hats or head coverings may be worn except for special events, for religious exemptions, or under extenuating circumstances. For health reasons, footwear must be worn at all times. Should a student come to school inappropriately dressed, or in a way that is causing disruption, a school representative will discuss the matter with the student and contact the parent, if necessary. 

Student Pick-Up/Drop-Off

We encourage parents to use the pick-up lanes in both parking lots to pick their child(ren) up at the end of the school day. Please follow the quidelines below so that the line of cars moves quickly and everyone can get in and out safely.

- 1. When using the pick-up lane stay inside your vehicle and pull as far forward as possible to pick-up your child(ren) along the curb.
- 2. Communicate with your child(ren) which lot you will be waiting at and encourage them to be out looking for you as soon as they can.
- 3. Please use a designated parking space if you need to get out of your car for any reason so you don't block other cars in the pick-up lane.
- 4. Please do not ask your child(ren) to walk across the parking lot on their own. All children walking in the parking lot need to be accompanied by an adult.
- 5. Do not use the circle drive for pick-up until after 4:00pm.
- 6. Traffic flows better if those coming from the east use the east parking lot and those coming from the west use the west lot.
- 7. PLEASE BE CAREFUL! DO NOT HURRY!



Dear Parent/Guardian:

We would like to offer your student the opportunity to participate in a program at Rosewood Elementary called "Hand2Hand". This program helps provide a student with food for the weekends and is intended for families who currently may be experiencing a financial burden. The first backpack is set to be delivered on September 15.

Here's how Hand2Hand will work: At the end of the week students who are signed up for the program will receive a minimum of 8-10 food items in a black school logo drawstring bag that will be provided at the first week of participation. These food items will be a combination of breakfast, snacks, lunch and/or dinner items. While the food items are meant for the student, they can be shared among the family as well. (Please note: if your student or another family member has food allergies it will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian to check the contents of the backpack each week to ensure the food doesn't contain ingredients which could cause an allergic reaction).

There is no cost to participate! If you sign your student up to receive Hand2Hand, they will continue to receive the weekly bags each week they are at Rosewood. However, if down the road you no longer need the assistance, simply write a note expressing your desire to discontinue receiving Hand2Hand bags and give this note to the school office.
